The Museum opened in April 2005 on the site of the Glen Burnie historic house and gardens. On view in the house are objects original to the earliest Wood and Glass families. They include paintings, fine furniture, and decorative objects acquired by Julian Wood Glass Jr. for his ancestral home.

The second level of the Museum presents four main galleries:

- ✓ Shenandoah Valley Gallery explores the Valley history, and decorative arts made in the Valley from the mid-1700s to the present.
- ✓ Julian Wood Glass Jr Gallery. presents the collection assembled by one of the valley's most significant private collectors.
- ✓ R. Lee Taylor Gallery presents a collection of furnished miniature houses and rooms.
- ✓ Changing Exhibition Gallery displays a continually changing exhibition.

The tour bus will leave Blacksburg Square at 7:30 a.m. Guests are welcome
